HEERF III Quarterly Report

The CARES Act established the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF). This directed institutions of Higher Education to use the funds to provide emergency financial aid grants to students. The Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund III (HEERF III) is authorized by the **American Rescue Plan (ARP)**, Public Law 117-2, signed into law on March 11, 2021, in support to institutions of higher education to serve students and ensure learning continues during the COVID-19 pandemic. ARP funds are in addition to funds authorized by the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA), Public Law 116-260 and the Coronavirus Aid, Recovery, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, Public Law 116-136.

The Ailey School has accepted from the Department the Certification and Supplemental Agreement for the funds under Section 314(a)(1) HEERF III of the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021. The Ailey School has used, or intends to use, the applicable amounts of funds designated under CRRSAA to provide Emergency Financial Grants to students.

The Ailey School OPE ID 203760 is providing this information to the public in accordance with the Electronic Announcement of May 6, 2020 by the U.S. Department of Education.

The Ailey School (The School) acknowledges the following:

- The School has received \$98,920 from the U.S. Department of Education under Section 314(a)(1) of the CRRSAA Act pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students. The award number is P425F203760.
- As of March 31, 2022, \$98,920 was distributed to qualified students. As of today, The School has a zero balance.
- A total of 71 students at The School were awarded emergency financial aid grant under HEERF III.
- Funds were awarded to assist with expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to the pandemic such as food, housing, course materials, technology, health care and child care.
- The method used by The School to determine which students received emergency grant funds are as follows:

Based on the guidance provided by the US Department of Education (ED), students who attended in the Spring 2022 semester were identified. Students who were PELL eligible, students with high need and students who at census were registered as full time students were considered for funds. The maximum award was \$2,000.
